



Fall Discover Events

Troop Engagement Specialists will also host events in communities across the state!

We'll flyer the girls in the schools, post flyers and yard signs around town, get into schools to talk to the girls and then host a fun event! If you are not able to host your own event, we would still welcome your presence at our council hosted event.

Existing Girl Scouts are being asked to bring a friend in order to attend these sign up events.

The theme is around the Solutions Superstar fun patch just released from GSUSA. They will be working to save bears or other "creatures" from the lava. This teambuilding activity will help them with problem solving and has a great positive outcome.

Another activity we'll be doing is a Memory Maze in which they get to do a bit of coding. They'll determine what the code is for each shape/color they place into a maze and must remember the "code" when trying to get through the maze.

Be sure to communicate with your TE Specialist regarding the number of girls you are willing to take into your troop!






Volunteer Award Nominations Open on August 1st!!


