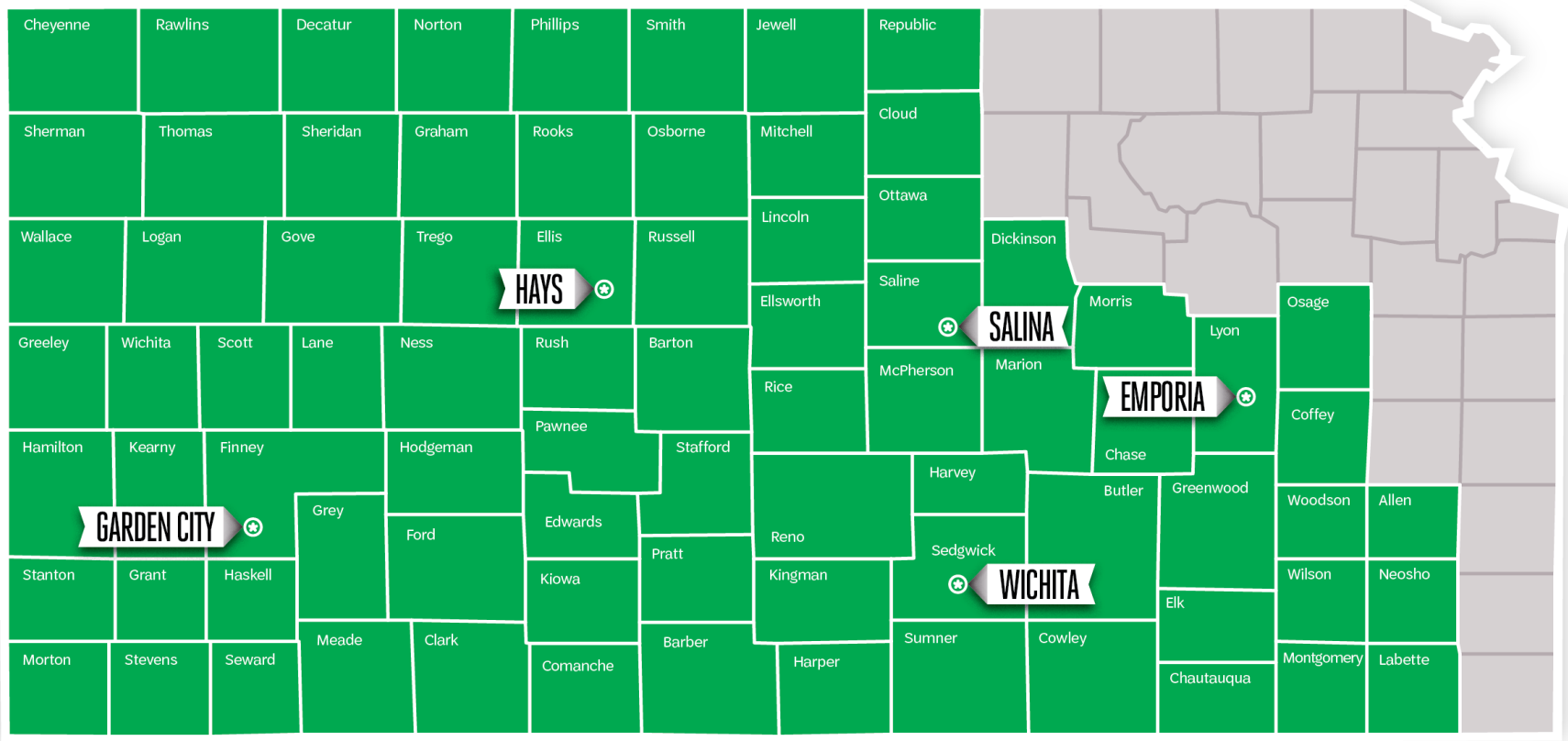

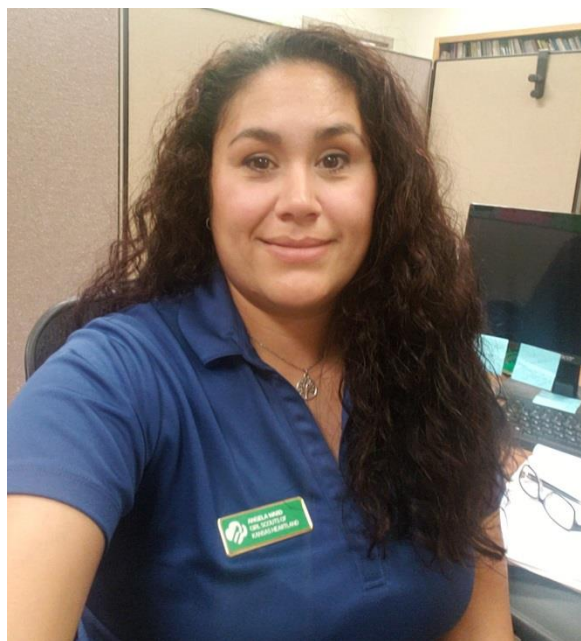
Wichita
